## Literacy



Reading and Writing - P7 will read and discuss their reading within their guided reading groups. This term they will cover a range of texts which will include - classic fiction, non-fiction, non-chronological reports, poetry, recounts, biography and autobiography. Comprehension texts will also cover a range of genre. Children will experience a variety of writing tasks and will be encouraged to revise and edit their work so that it is the best they can produce.


